deau, Joseph Frobisher, Rebert Cruickshank, Gabriel Franchere, William Mailland, Jacques Hervieux, James Caldwell, Jean Guillaume Deliste, George King, François Desrivieres, James Grant, Louis Chaboillez, Samuel Gerrard, Louis Guy, George Leith and Jean Baptiste Tabeau, good and lawful men of the district aforesaid, then and there sworn and charged to enquire for our faid Lord the King for the body of the District aforesaid it is presented in manner and form as followeth, that is to say, Montreal The Juurors for our Sovereign Lord the King upon their Oath to wit. present, that Charles Baptiste Bouc, late of the Parish of St. Louis. commonly called the Parish of Terrebonne in the County of Effingbam, in the district of Montreal Esquire, Charles Renault, late of the Parish of Saint Anne, commonly called the Parish of Mascouche in the County of Leinster in the district of Montreal yeoman, Jean Baptiste Coll late of the faid Parish of Saint Anne yeoman, Antoine Lauzon late of the said Parish of Saint Anne yeoman, and Magdeleine Collard the wife of Antoine Roture dit Belisse of the said Parish of Saint Anne labourer, wickedly and maliciously devising and intending unjustly to empoverish, vex, oppress and aggrieve one Etienne Drouin, and also unjustly and unlawfully to obtain and acquire to themselves of and from the faid Etienne Drouin divers large fums of Money on the fourteenth day of February in the Thirty-eighth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third by the Grace of God of Great Britain, France and Ireland King, Defender of the Faith, and so forth, at the aforesaid Parish of Saint Louis in the County and district aforesaid, wickedly and unlawfully did among themselves conspire, combine, consederate and agree salsely and without any reasonable or probable cause whatever, to charge and accuse the said Etienne Drouin with having fraudulently moistened and wetted a certain large quantity of Wheat, which he the faid Etienne Drouin had fold and delivered to the faid Charles Baptiste Bouc in the Thirty-fourth year of the reign of our faid Sovereign Lord the King, previous to the fale and delivery thereof by him the faid Etienne Drouin to him the faid Charles Baptiste Bouc, and the Jurors aforesaid, upon their oath aforesaid, do further present, that the said Charles Baptiste Bouc in pursuance of and according to the said conspiracy, combination, confederacy and agreement between him and the said Charles Renault, Jean Baptiste Coll, Antoine Lauzon and Magdeleine Collard so had as aforesaid afterwards, to wit, on the fifteenth day of February, in the thirty-eighth
