Gaol Limits Bill
brought up.

A Deputation from the Commons' House of Assembly being announced, it was admitted, and brought up for the concurrence of this House, a Bill, entitled, "An Act to repeal part of, and amend, the Laws now in force assigning limits to Gaols in this Province."

Read first time.

The Sedition Law Re-
peal Bill brought up.
