cil reported, That the Committee would agree to the Refolves of the House, respecting Bounties and Premiums, as also respecting the Roads, provided there be a Fund appropriated for those Purposes.

Whereupon Refolved, That this House conceive the House of Affembly pledged to provide for the Payment of the Sums voted this Seffions, fo far as the Revenue of the Province shall prove deficient for fuch Purposes, after Payment of civil Establishment as voted by the Sessions. House for the Year 1786.

The above Refolve was fent to the Council, as also a Message, That Sent to the Council this House had appointed a Committee to meet a Committee of the Council on the expediency of erecting publick Buildings for the better Accomodation of the General Assembly, and Courts of Judicature.

A Meffage from His Excellency the Governor requiring the Attendance of the House of Affembly in the Council Chamber.

The Speaker with the Houfe accordingly attended, when his Excellency was pleafed to give his Affent to the following Bills, viz.

An Act for continuing An Act of the General Affembly of this Province intitled, An AI for more effectually raifing a Revenue within this Province for the Support of its Government, as also for continuing and explaining An Act entitled, An Act for the more effectually raising a Duty of Excise on Wine, Rum, and certain other Enumerated Articles and for preventing Frauds in the Collection of the Revenue.

An Aft for continuing the several Laws therein mentioned.

- An AET in Addition to, and Amendment of An AET for establishing and regulating Ferries.
- An Alt to empower the Justices of the Peace to hold Special Courts of Seftions for the Purposes therein mentioned.
- An Act for establishing the Times and Places of bolding the several Courts of Justice in the County of Cumberland.
- An Act to encourage and extend the export of Fish, Lumber and other Produce of this Province to the West Indies, and also to revive, alter and continue the several Laws, relating to the Duties of Impost on Beer, Rum, and other distilled Spirituous Liquors, which Laws expired the Twenty First Day of December, 1784.

Then the Clerk of the Council, by his Excellency Command declared the General Assembly prorogued to Tuesday the Second Day of March next, and the fame was prorogued accordingly.
