Stonewall Jackson

THIS is the 50th anniversary of the death of Stonewall Jackson, Confederate General. General Jackson was not named Stonewall by his parents, who preferred Thomas Jonathan, but by the entire Union army, after it had run up against Jackson in the performance of his duty. The only foe that Stonewall Jackson ever turned his back to was liquor, profanity, backbiting and other similar pursuits.



General Jackson was born in the mountains of Western Virginia when a mere child, and soon after was made an orphan without any action on his part. After attending country school and learning how to throw the damp paper with unerring accuracy, young Jackson worked his passage into West Point and took the full course, including the highest degree in plain and fancy haz-

ard. When the Mexican war broke out, Stonewall broke out with it and returned home with a collection of shoulder straps which caused him so much embarrassment that he had to cover it with a heavy undergrowth of whiskers.

At the opening of the Civil War Jackson offered his sword to his state, which commissioned him to attack, defeat, scatter, separate, segregate and decimate the Union army whenever he felt in the mood for doing so. As Jackson was in this mood about nine-tenths of the time, his methods of doing business became very annoying to the Union generals, who were never able to whip him with any success except in the press despatches to the northern papers.

General Jackson had the disagreeable habit of running around the Union army in circles and then penetrating a neat surprise by piercing it in the left flank with great vivacity. It was while engaged in one of these movements that Jackson encountered the fire of some of his own men and fell. His death stilled a valiant, chivalrous heart and deprived the Confederate army of its most successful general.

H. Hammond takes charge of organizing and managing Scout Troop at the First Baptist church (and the local Scout Council trusts that he will), several carter troops and patrols will have to look to their laurels.

The Brantford Scout Bugle Band acquitted itself splendidly at the recent church parade. If Bugle Master Maich can raise the band to such a state of efficiency in a few weeks time, it should be second to none in a very few months.

Captain M. A. Colerhoun and Captain G. D. Watt will be asked to act as judges in the drill and display competition at Paris, for the Brantford district and Captain G. A. Ward will be requested to act as an officer in the marksman competition.

The Brantford Scouts will be pleased to see every member of the Brantford Scout Council at the Rally. The presence of the council will be very encouraging to the local troop and the officers will greatly appreciate its attendance en masse.

General Notes.
The Brantford Scout Council will very shortly launch a Scout Employment Bureau in order to assist Scouts in securing suitable positions when they leave school. This idea should meet with the warmest approval of employers and Scouts. The council will have a complete list of Scouts requiring positions on Saturdays, and

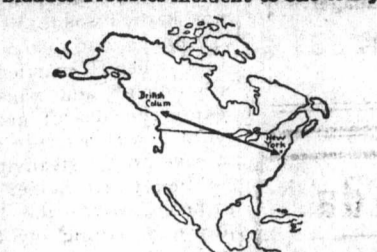

So severe was the heat that they had ultimately to fly from their homes into the street. The fire brigade eventually mastered the outbreak, but not before Father Rooney's house had been rendered uninhabitable.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS

ANY PERSON who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must wear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agency for the District, territory by patent conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of twenty-five years.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right, and cannot obtain a pre-emption right, may purchase a homestead in certain districts, price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land, or a contract for each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent), and cultivate a certain acreage.

In the case of firms, the actual signature, the nature of the occupation, and place of residence of each member of the firm must be given.

Each tender must be accompanied by an accepted cheque on a chartered bank, payable to the order of the Honourable the Minister of Public Works, equal to ten per cent. (10%) of the amount of the tender, which will be forfeited if the person tendering declines to enter into a contract when called upon to do so, or fail to complete the work contracted for. If the tender is not accepted, the cheque will be returned.

The Department does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender.
