Damage estimated at more than \$1,000,000 was done recently by a northeast gale which swept the New Jersey

Sea Bright, N. J., where the gale attained a maximum velocity of ninety-eight miles, was almost devastated by the wind and the highest tide ever known there. Handsome cottages were swept into the sea, miles of boardwalk and bulkneads destroyed and the streets torn up for yards inland.
