Town of Wolfville

The use of wooden shingles for roofing new buildings or renewing old roofs is hereby prohibited in the o'd wolf-ville within that area bounded and described as follows:

— Commencing at a point in the South line of the lands of the Dominion. Atlantic Railway, such point being in line with the West boundary of University arenue, thence by such West bound, Southerly to a point ig line with the South boundary to a point in the West boundary of University arenue, thence by such West bound, Southerly in o Power brown, formerly of Colin W. Roscof whence in a straight line to said Percy Brown, formerly of Colin by said South line and a tartaight line to said Percy Brown a said South line and a by said South line and a line in continuation thereof to the East side line of Glaspereau avenue and by the East side line of Glaspereau avenue, thence by East side line of Glaspereau avenue, the East side line of Glaspereau avenue, and a line in continuation thereof to the lands of the Dominion Atlantic Railway Company and thence by the said last mentioned lands Westerly to the place of beginning.

Any roof or part of roof, placed or constructed in contravention of the foregoing provisions may by order of the town Council, be removed and replaced with other roofing at the expense of the owner of the building or offending party, whether owner or otherwise.
