Now he has been elevated to the cabinet rank and will sit at the council board with Premier Borden, Sir George Foster, Hon. J. D. Hazen and others who are frequently des-

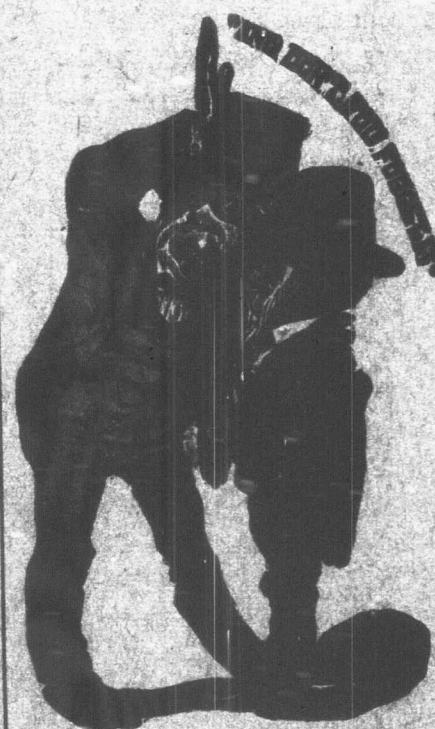

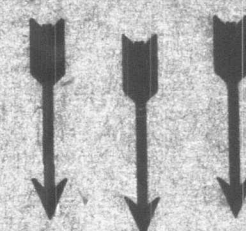
