After discussing the question with the various live stock associations, it was concluded that the adoption of the auction sale principle would be of great benefit to Canada, and the Depart-

ment of Agriculture offered to assist in live stock sales in each province. Several provincial sales have been held and the feeling in favor of them is growing rapidly. Similar independent combination sales are being held in many parts of Canada and a fine pavilion has been erected especially for auction sales at Hamilton, Ontario. 
