

Noonday, both of Gloucester, U.S., reporting equal to 350 to 400 quintals each. All three vessels report favorably of the fishery prospects on Grand Banks this season.

Messrs. Duff & Balmer have heard that their second banker the Olianda, had been in at Cape Canso, about the middle of May, for a second supply of bait; she had 250 quintals from the western Banks on the first baiting.

We hope to be enabled soon to note the arrival of the Snow Bird, with a good trip.

The Henry West, having landed her trip of fish, left Tuesday evening, for the Bay to look for bait for second trip to the Banks.

During the last week or so, our Labrador people have been busy in preparing for their departure. Some few vessels have already left for the coast, and the end of next week will, no doubt, see the last of the fleet away. We heartily wish them one and all a safe and speedy passage to the fields of their labor where, we hope, every success may attend them.

The Laodamia, Captain Melzac, arrived here, Friday last from Charlottetown, with a cargo of potatoes to Messrs. Penney Brothers.

The Volante, Captain Emberley, arrived from Montreal Monday last, with a large cargo of flour, pork, butter, and sundries, to Hon'ble John Rorke.

Review.—The weather on Saturday last, the day set apart for the celebration of the Queen's birthday—was warm and sunshiny, and such as in the phraseology of a native linguist, peculiarly belongs to a borrowed day. The occasion was not observed, as we anticipated it would be, a general close-up but a large number whose business was not very pressing about noon found their way to the parade ground, and in company with their sisters, (and other fellows sisters) cousins and aunts made a goodly show. About 11.45 five companies arrived on the ground, viz., 3 companies of Bio-Jackets, 1 company of Marines, and 1 from Constabulary force, including of course our renowned Cavalry. About noon a salute of 21 guns was thundered forth from H. M. S. Druid, followed by a feu-de-joye by all the companies above mentioned. Between the last salute 25 guns were fired from a cannon on the parade. Here the little ones commenced to howl, and ladies [the sensitive creatures] to become deaf by the application of many dainty fingers to the organ of hearing—a fact which in no wise we can assure our readers tended towards the bottling of a laugh from the inconsiderate youth or caused those heroes known as bachelors to loudly grin within their sleeves. During the said howling and fring three cheers for Her gracious Majesty the Queen were given, after which the companies marched past in quick time quarter-column distance, &c. The Police on the occasion wore their new military helmets. During the drill there were certainly a few mistakes made, but they were overlooked by a forbearing audience, and swallowed as it were with the enjoyment of the occasion.—Chronicle.
