NEW CARDINAL LIST FOR NEXT CONSISTORY

English and United States Archbishops to be Elevated—Twenty-Two Vacancies—Archbishop Bourne, of Westminster, Succeeds Two Famous Cardinals.

Rome, Nov. 3.—The pope will create a large number of cardinals at the consistory to be held on November 27. The Most Rev. John M. Farley, archbishop of New York, and the Most Rev. Wm. H. O'Connell, archbishop of Boston, are among those who will receive the red hat.

Archbishop Bourne. The elevation of Archbishop Bourne to the cardinalate removes a grievance which English Roman Catholics have harbored under since the death of Cardinal Vaughan in 1890.

Supremacy of Irish See. Since that date the only cardinal in the British Isles was Cardinal Logue, Archbishop of Armagh and Cardinal Primate of all Ireland. As the only member of the college in the United Kingdom Cardinal Logue took precedence of all other bishops.

A Young Cardinal. The Most Rev. Francis Bourne, Archbishop of Westminster, is comparatively young, having been born in 1861 at Clapham, England. He received his educational course from the University of London and was ordained a priest in 1884. He was appointed coadjutor to the Bishop of Southwark in 1897 and later, when he was selected to succeed Cardinal Vaughan.

His Fanciful Predecessors. Cardinal Newman, the author of that world-famous hymn, "Lead Me Not into Temptation," was the most notable Englishman to whom the papal throne succeeds as the head of the Roman Catholic church in England.

Calgary, Nov. 6.—The members of Knox Presbyterian Church, Lettbridge, have extended a call to Rev. W. D. Reid, superintendent of missions with headquarters at Calgary, to succeed Rev. A. Mc. Gordon, at a salary of \$2,500 per year, with the use of a manse. Rev. Mr. Reid has received a telegram to this effect, but his decision has not yet been announced.

Rev. Mr. Reid is at present out of the city, and will intimate his decision to the Lettbridge board within a few days. It is his intention, it is hinted by some of his friends that he is a great admirer of the Rev. Mr. Reid, and is interested in his home mission work. He is unlikely to accept this flattering call.

Rev. Mr. Reid is considered one of the ablest preachers in the west. He has refused several calls to other churches. The Lettbridge congregation is very hopeful of his taking his favorable consideration. Knox Church, Lettbridge, is one of the largest and most influential Presbyterian congregations in Alberta.
