FAMOUS ARTIST AT HIS BEST IN DESIGNS FOR LAVISH SETS FOR PRINCE'S PALACE AND VILLA.

"Enemies of Women," Cosmopolitan Corporation's gigantic production of the Janez story, which will be screened at the Nickel Theatre on Monday next, proved a happy hunting ground for the scenic artist, Joseph Urban. lt is full to the brim with atmosphere. Mr. Urban revels in stories that hold atmosphere, for it is his task at the Cosmopolitan's studios to re-create for the camera's devouring eye the particular scenic atmosphere of the story being prepared. Coming to the screen with his rare gifts, Mr. Urban has set up a higher, truer, more imaginary type of picture setting than the films had ever known before.
