A Plea for Practical Education

THE TELEGRAM RECEIVED THE FOLLOWING DESPATCH THIS MORNING FROM MR. H. ARCHIBALD.

Editor Evening Telegram.

Note your editorial on Mount Pearl Station we believe you wrote it with a purely altruistic intention, and we say is not in criticism of your intention. Nfld. needs an industrial school for all our sons and daughters—not one with huge fences, but one with roads leading to it from all angles and one with side walls of this quartz class, so that not one who may raise his eyes will fail to see an opportunity for training that would do more Nfld. her material, social, moral and spiritual life in the coming years than all other educational endeavours beyond a good sound intermediate grade standard. Let us have an industrial school by all means, and let all our schools, colleges, and Normal school introduce immediately full and proper courses in political economy. Let us provide the proper stones for our boys from primary education to the practical life work ahead. At present the only avenue open to our boys are professional courses abroad that, with the exception of medicine and law, leads them out into the world with never a chance to get back to their own homeland. We need our young men and particularly our technically trained ones to build up this little land of misfortune the only way that counts, and that is by the development of our resources into valuable products of consumption. The people want work. They want bread and butter and they need trained leaders in every industrial pursuit including the fisheries.

Forest Fire Reported

Last evening Chief Ranger T. Howe reported to the Minister of Agriculture and Mines that the Warden at Aquaforte had informed him that a forest fire was raging in that vicinity, and that he had issued instructions to have all the residents available engaged to fight the blaze if any danger threatened. No further particulars of the fire has been received, but it is believed that the outbreak was not as serious as at first thought. Only on Tuesday, in pursuance of his policy towards saving the forests, the Minister of Agriculture visited Holyrood and appointed Fire Wardens for that section, as it contains the best timber on the Avalon Peninsula, and the feared danger owing to the large number of men now working on the road between Holyrood and Salmonford.

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
