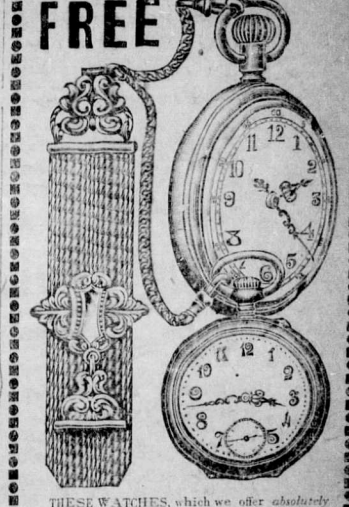
Venezuela Has a Revolution.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS

THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of valuable Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta, the applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at the office of any Local Agent of Dominion Lands, (not sub-agent) on certain conditions. Entry—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteaded land may be sold to the homesteader on a farm of at least 30 acres on certain conditions. A habitable house is required in every case, except when residence is performed in the vicinity. A homesteaded land may be mortgaged in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$200 per acre. Entry—Six months residence in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and 60 acres extra cultivation. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of ranch, scrubby or stony land after report by Homestead Inspector on application for patent. A homesteaded land may be sold to the homesteader and cannot obtain a pre-emption in any other form purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$200 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.
