PROHIBITION IN RUSSIA.

The Russian Duma has passed a law forbidding the sale of liquors containing more than a very small proportion of alcohol; the only exception as made in favor of certain native wines, which are not highly intoxicating. This law makes permanent the prohibition of liquor drinking that was enforced two years ago as a war measure. The Duma has also passed a law giving the peasants civil rights equal to those enjoyed by the rest of the population. When serfdom was abolished, the Russian peasant did not receive full electoral and civil rights, and it has long been the aim of the Liberals to remove that disability.
