DEATH OF PAUL PEEL.

A feeling of profound sorrow was created in the city yesterday when the Advertiser bulletined the fact that Paul Peel, the famous Canadian artist, had died that afternoon in Paris, France.

And sincere were the words of condolence that were extended to the grief-stricken parent and brothers and sisters of the deceased.

Londoners had an opportunity of meeting their talented fellow-townsmen in September and October, 1890, when his mother's last illness brought him to his native city from the sunny land of his adoption.

As a painter, Paul Peel was born, not made, for his earliest tastes and inclinations tended strongly in the direction of his chosen profession.

In 1880 Mr. Peel went to London, England, where he studied in the British Museum, and began to paint for the Royal Academy.

It was a great advantage to Mr. Peel to have sat at the feet of several of the masters; it saved him from the slightest tendency to become a mere imitator of any one of them.

Paul Peel was a hard worker, but he was not a mechanical drudge.

Since then the picture was purchased for their national gallery by one of the European continental governments,

Mr. Peel was married to a Danish lady, Miss Isabella Verdis, on Jan. 16, 1888, at Willesden, England.

The general impression has been that when Mr. Peel's father crossed the Atlantic this summer he visited his famous son.

Breach of Promise Suit for \$20,000 Damages.

True Bill Found Against Mr. Mercier for Conspiracy-The Grounded Steamer City of Georgia Released.

The steamship State of Georgia, which was aground at Cape a Laroch, has been taken to Quebec.

Rev. J. R. Black, of the Congregational Church, Barrie, has accepted a call to Bethel Church, Kingston.

The Conservatives have selected Dr. La Chapelle as their candidate in Hochelaga county for the House of Commons.

Mrs. Kiesel, who was seriously burned at Winnipeg when the contents of a lamp were accidentally spilled over her, has died.

At the Quebec Criminal Court on Tuesday the jury reported a true bill in the case of the Quebecers, Mercier for conspiracy on all three counts.

Major-General Herbert says he is fairly satisfied with the result of his recent tour of inspection in the west.

McCarthy & Co., Toronto, acting for Nellie McGowan, on Monday issued a writ against J. W. Stevenson, a well-known and wealthy farmer of Pickering township, claiming \$20,000 damages for breach of promise of marriage.

A vestry meeting of the congregation of the Church of the Ascension, Hamilton, has fixed the stipend of the new rector, Rev. W. H. Wade, at \$2,000 a year, with free use of the rectory.

G. T. R. earnings for week ending Oct. 8, 1892, were \$425,989, an increase of \$15,148 over the same week last year.

At Toronto on Tuesday Arthur York was convicted of the manslaughter of his infant son, and sentenced to three years' imprisonment.

Joseph Patterson, men's furnishings establishment, Yonge and Adelaide streets, Toronto, has assigned. Liabilities about \$40,000 and assets somewhat less.

Mr. Alex. McPherson, proprietor of the Queen's Hotel, Stratford, died Tuesday morning, after a short illness. He was a son-in-law of Mr. Bishop, the former premier.

At Toronto the second charge of murder against Frank Wilson, the man acquitted of killing his wife, was traversed till next assizes, the prisoner being allowed out on \$2,000 bail.
