Agreement and Bylaw

NO.

THIS AGREEMENT made this day

of January, in the year of our Lord

One Thousand Eight Hundred and

Ninety-Four, by and between the Cor-

poration of the City of London of the

first part, hereinafter called "the Cor-

poration," and the Grand Trunk Rail-

way Company of Canada, hereinafter

called "the Company," of the second

part.

WHEREAS the Company has in contem-

plation the erection of car shops at the

City of London, upon the site or in the im-

mediate neighborhood, within the city, of the

former site of the car shops of the said Com-

pany, which were destroyed by fire, and the

Company, in order to induce the Company to
