
Four Hurt At Sarnia When **Auto Crashes Into**

POLICE SEARCHING FOR MURDERER OF DR. RAMSEY RANKIN

Two Women and Two Men Are Being Held by the Officials.

MONTREAL, June 1 .- (By Canadia: Press).—The inquest into the death of Dr. Ramsay David Rankin, who died early this morning at the Western Hos-pital of wounds suffered during a fight in an apartment house at 624 St. Catharine street west, will take place to-morrow morning before Coronor Mc-Mahon. Chief of Police Pierre Belanger stated tonight that the detectives were still looking for the man who is stated to have caused Rankin's death, while Chief of Detectives Le Page said that his men rounded up all the witnesses and persons implicated in the case. CAUSES ACCIDENT

Chief Le Page said in this connection that two men and two women, supposed to have been in the apartment house at the time of the tragedy, were being held. The women lived next door

at flat, No. 11, the glass in the door of which had been broken as well as that in No. 12, occupied by James Brown Gunn, where the fight started. Information was given the coroner today in preparing for the inquest, to the effect that the party had consisted of four men. Dr. Rankin and one of the other members of the party had come a few days ago from Stratford, Ont. As far as could be learned, Dr. Rankin and spent vesteday, in driving kin had spent yesterday in driving around in automobiles, and at 4 in the afternoon the party went to Gunn's apartment and sat there drinking until the tragedy occurred, shortly before 11.

An argument started between Rankin and another of the party, Roy McEach-ren, according to information given by the neighbors today. The argument was over cards and general personalities. This led to a scuffle in which Rankin fell against the glass in one of the doors the apartment.

Stratford with Rankin, is then alleged
to have run away, and was later found
at his room at the Windsor Hotel by
detectives. He is said to be one of the
four witnesses held for the inquest.


