THEY APPROVE DIVORCE COURT.

Middlesex Bar Adopt Resolution Unanimously. Discuss Judges Who Are Company Directors.

Fight Shy of Question of Judges and Commissions.

The members of the Middlesex Law Association at a meeting held in the law library at the Court House yesterday, unanimously approved of a resolution asking for the establishment of divorce courts in Canada.

Another proposal that provoked discussion was the "increase of Judges' salaries and their exclusion from participating in work outside the regular duties of the office." The matter of salaries had already been threshed out very fully. The meeting was agreed that judges should be better paid. On the balance of the clause the feeling was not so unanimous, and a certain disposition to fight shy of it was apparent.

Mr. Purdom wanted to know if reference was had to judges taking directorships. Mr. Jeffery believed no one could say their doing so took much of the judges' time.

Mr. Weld believed that for a judge to be director of a financial institution in his own town was worse than to act in a Toronto institution. Mr. Jeffery did not believe this county had witnessed anything serious.

Mr. Bartlett thought there was no use beating about the bush. It was not directorships that the clause had reference to, but judges acting upon commissions.

Mr. Gibbons said he really had no opinion upon this phase of the thing. He asked if any benefit could accrue from introducing a political discussion here?

The matter dropped. The need of bankruptcy legislation was generally recognized. The impossibility of obtaining it was also felt, and no action was taken. Reduction of disbursements in High and County Court proceedings was agreed upon as very desirable, and a better system of promulgating rules of practice was likewise recognized as a good thing. Surrogate Court costs were spoken of as being needlessly burdensome.

On motion of Mr. Purdom, it was decided to refer all the questions in the programme submitted to the local benches, to take such action as they may deem advisable.
