The Case of Riel.

The Supreme Court of Manitoba has dismissed the appeal in Riel's case, and confirmed his conviction. Another case is open to his counsel, namely that of appeal to the Privy Council of England.

The Government will do well to let the law take its course in Riel's case. There are no justifying circumstances, and nothing but Riel's execution will satisfy the great majority of the people of Canada.

Since the above was written, an Ottawa telegram has been received which says that Riel's Counsel have given notice to the Governor-General in England, and that under those circumstances the judge who tried the case will be a matter of course postponed to the carrying out of the sentence until the final decision on the constitutionality of his court is given by the judicial committee.
