

LIVELY FILIBURY CENTRE

Visited by the World's Explorer in Young Man.

A Place Which for its Age is Far Ahead of the Times - The Assessment for 1899 shows a Population of 1000 - Increasing Structures - Prosperous Business Men.

The village of Filibury Centre, geographically speaking, is nearly in Essex and nearly in Kent. It is on the G. Division of the M.C.R., 22 miles southeast of Chatham, the county seat, and 36 miles east of Sandwich. It is also a station on the line of the C.P.R. recently constructed between Windsor and London, and this additional railway facility cannot fail to exert a beneficial influence on its future progress and prosperity. It gives the competing line, without which manufacturers are generally seriously handicapped. The first survey was made in 1870, and the growth of the place was greatly accelerated by the building of the railway. In 1887 it was incorporated as a village, with a population of a trifle over 1000. The present year's assessment roll shows the population to be about the same. For a young place it has developed wonderful enterprises, and the enterprises are superior to those of many much larger places. Last year the Holly system of waterworks was put in at a cost of \$15,000. The water is brought by a gravity system from Lake Erie, 23 miles distant. The tank at the M.C.R. is supplied by the village, for which service the railway company pays \$800 annually. Only one master of a milline when the waterworks will be self-sufficient. In connection with these there is a fine station, hose reel, 1000 feet of hose and a fire company.

The school house is a good brick building, with two teachers. There is also a French separate school with two teachers. The churches consist of Presbyterian, Methodist, Congregational, Church of England and an R. C. outside the corporation. The Army is also represented.

An 8-page paper called The Filibury Times, published by W. A. Shaw, represents the town. It is in its sixth year and appears to be appreciated and well sustained.

The East Filibury Agricultural Association have their grounds and buildings here, the trade being one of the attractions. The annual shows are, as might be expected in such a fertile section, very successful. A silver course holds the members of which are handsomely uniformed, and special awards are made in the evenings and on special occasions. Filibury is one of the few places where a roller skating rink still flourishes. In a great majority of places they have been converted into livery stables, furniture warehouses, and some cases into business places, but here it is still used for the purpose for which it was originally built.

The buildings erected lately mark the progress both in material wealth and architectural taste. There are several fine business blocks, and among the residences the following are special mention: James Stewart, J. S. Richardson, W. J. Moffat, A. R. Nichol and James Kidd. The houses of the latter consist of the following: J. S. Richardson, rev. James Palmer, W. D. Smith, Alexander Campbell and C. Clark, councillors. A. A. Wilson is clerk. The total assessed value is \$1,175,000. Situated between Lake St. Clair and Lake Erie, the temperate climate is one of the desirable to be found on the continent. Fruits of all kinds, from the delicate peach to the hardy apple, are raised in the highest state of perfection. Early frosts being unknown, the crops never fail. It seems to be the right latitude for corn also, and it is more extensively cultivated than in any other section of the province. Fruit, corn, grain, lumber, cattle, hogs and turkeys constitute the chief exports.
