ASHFORD'S CAREER.

He did Kalakaua, the late king of the Hawaiian Islands some considerable service and as a reward he asked that the position of Attorney-General be given to his brother, while he himself was made Commandant of the militia. Shortly after the revolution of 1839, Col. Ashford joined the Republican party, becoming leader of one wing of the revolutionary forces. A short time ago, however, the government of the Islands, fearing a fresh outbreak, had a large number of the principal members of the Republican party, including Colonel Ashford, arrested, and held on a charge of high treason. Ashford's friends here, however, do not fear the result, as the supporters of the Republican party are very strong, and the government will scarcely wish to bring on an uprising by imposing any very severe penalty. When quite young he fought in the American civil war and displayed much bravery, and as a boy at school it was remarked of him that he "would sooner fight than eat." These qualities, together with splendid oratorial abilities, enabled him to make his law practice about the population of Honolulu, a mixed and troublesome one, a lucrative one, The amount of business done by the Hawaiian courts is exceedingly large for so small a country, and the incolae which the law brought Colonel, Ashford every year is estimated at about \$20,000. The sentence likely to be passed on him will for this reason probably entail a considerable loss to him, especially if the government should confiscate the property of those accused of treason.
