*The Canadian Embassy to the Secretariat of State for Foreign Affairs of the
Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia*

The Canadian Embassy presents its compliments to the Secretariat of State for Foreign Affairs of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia and has the honour to refer to the Secretariat's Note No. 2134 of September 19, 1966 which reads as follows:

“ The Secretariat of State for Foreign Affairs of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia presents its compliments to the Canadian Embassy and has the honour to propose on behalf of the Government of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia, an Agreement concerning the waiver of fees on visas in the following terms:

- (a) The Government of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia shall waive fees on all types of non-immigrant visas for persons who wish to travel to Yugoslavia and who hold valid Canadian passports.
- (b) The Government of Canada shall waive fees on all types of non-immigrant visas for persons who wish to travel to Canada and who hold valid Yugoslav passports.
- (c) The Agreement shall enter into force on the 1st of January 1967, and shall remain in force until terminated by either Government giving six months' notice in writing to the other.

If the foregoing terms are acceptable to the Government of Canada, the Secretariat of State for Foreign Affairs has the honour to propose that the present Note together with the Embassy's reply in that sense shall be regarded as constituting an Agreement between the two Governments in this matter.

The Secretariat of State for Foreign Affairs avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the Canadian Embassy the assurances of its high consideration.”

The Canadian Embassy has the honour to state that the foregoing terms are acceptable and that the Government of Canada agrees that the Note of the Secretariat of State for Foreign Affairs and this reply shall constitute an Agreement between the two Governments in this matter.

The Canadian Embassy avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the Secretariat of State for Foreign Affairs the assurances of its high consideration.
