Mr. Doherty, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid on the Table,—Account of the average number of men employed on the Dominion Police Force during each month of the year 1916, and of their pay and travelling expenses, pursuant to Chapter 92, Section 6, Sub-section 2, of the Revised Statutes of Canada. (Sessional Papers, No. 59.)

Ordered, That Mr. McCraney have leave to bring in a Bill, No. 12, to amend the Dominion Lands Act.

He accordingly presented the said Bill to the House, and the same was received and read the first time; and ordered to be read a second time at the next sitting of the House.

The House then resumed the adjourned Debate on the proposed motion of Mr. Wilson (Wentworth) for an Address to His Excellency the Governor General, in answer to His Speech at the opening of the Session.

And the Debate continuing, the said Debate was, on motion of Mr. Kyte, seconded by Mr. Loggie, adjourned.

Mr. Speaker acquainted the House, That a Message had been brought from the Senate by their Clerk, as followeth:—

The Senate have appointed the Honourable Messieurs Bourque, Bostock, Boyer, Corby, Dennis, Douglas, Gillmor, Gordon, Landry, LaRivière, McHugh, McLennan, Poirier, Power and Sproule, a Committee to assist His Honour the Speaker in the direction of the Library of Parliament, so far as the interests of the Senate are concerned, and to act on behalf of the Senate as Members of a Joint Committee of both Houses on the said Library.

Also,—A Message acquainting this House that the Honourable Messieurs Cloran, Crosby, Curry, Dennis, De Veber, Domville, Donnelly, Forget, Gillmor, La Rivière, Legris, McCall, McLean, Pope, Prince, Ratz, Robertson, Sharpe, Shehyn, Talbot and Taylor, have been appointed a Committee to superintend the printing of the Senate, during the present Session, and to act on behalf of the Senate as Members of a Joint Committee of both Houses on the subject of the Printing of Parliament.

And also,—A Message acquainting this House that the Honourable Messieurs Landry, Taylor, Thompson and Watson, have been appointed a Committee to assist His Honour the Speaker in the direction of the Restaurant, so far as the interests of the Senate are concerned, and to act on behalf of the Senate as Members of a Joint Committee of both Houses on the said Restaurant.
