RESOLUTION 39.

A Resolution for the relief of Rena Cohen Newman.

[Adopted 23rd February, 1966.]

WHEREAS Rena Cohen Newman, residing at the city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec, wife of Norman Newman, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the said city, has by her petition alleged that they were married on the twenty-third day of April, A.D. 1944, at the said city, she then being Rena Cohen; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, on the ground of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore the Senate of Canada, pursuant to the provisions of the DISSOLUTION AND ANNULMENT OF MARRIAGES ACT and subject to section 2 thereof, resolves as follows:—

1. On the expiration of thirty days from the date of the adoption by the Senate of this resolution, the said marriage shall be dissolved and thenceforth shall be null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.
