81. Canadian Writers Foundation, \$4,000.  
 82. Grant toward expenses of the empire press union conference to be held in Ottawa in 1950, \$65,000.

## General—

83. To provide for expenses of the tariff board, \$98,840.  
 84. To provide for the expenses of the comptroller of the treasury's office, \$10,459,000.  
 85. Farmers' Creditors Arrangement Act, 1943, and Municipal Improvements Assistance Act, 1938, administration, \$39,631.  
 86. The Farm Improvement Loans Act, 1944, and The Veterans' Business and Professional Loans Act, 1946—administration, \$52,795.

87. Foreign exchange control board—administration, \$252,700.

88. Telephone service at Ottawa, \$415,000.
