Question No. 1,458—Mr. Lambert (Bellechasse):

During the 1976-77 fiscal year, did Canada import cheese and, if so (a) in what volume (b) which kinds and, in each case (i) in what quantity (ii) at what price per pound?

Mr. Bernard Loiselle (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Industry, Trade and Commerce): Statistics Canada report the following: during the 1976-77 fiscal year, Canada imported 49,135,200 pounds of cheese for a total value of \$52,598,758. A breakdown by kind and price appears on the following table.

YOUNG CANADA WORKS PROGRAM

Question No. 1,466—Mr. Allard:

1. Since the implementation of the Young Canada at Work Programme, did the government allocate money to the Constituency of Rimouski and, if so, in what amount?

2. For each project accepted, what was the (a) name of the project (b) amount allocated (c) year of acceptance (d) name of the municipality involved (e) number of jobs created?

Hon. Bud Cullen (Minister of Employment and Immigration): 1. Yes. \$421,000 for the summer of 1977 and \$316,000 for the summer of 1978.

2. See table below for 1977. The 1978 projects approval process is under way and therefore data is not available for this year. Regarding 2(b): For 1977, approved projects totalled \$419,330 which is \$1,670 less than the 1977 allocation. This amount was too small to approve another project, therefore was not utilized in the Rimouski constituency.
