**Mr. Speaker:** Order, please. I have only two very brief things to say. The House will realize, I am sure, that it would have been most inappropriate for me to anticipate this decision in any way. Therefore I have not arranged and have no intention of making any arrangements for any hospitality.

**Some hon. Members:** Oh, oh!

**An hon. Member:** Why not?

**Mr. Speaker:** Hon. members would not have expected me to anticipate any result one way or the other, at least I hope so. Therefore, I will not, I repeat, not be in the usual environment after this sort of event.

The second is that this House stands adjourned until eleven o'clock tomorrow morning.
