34. A senator may speak to any question before the Senate; or upon a motion, or an amendment to be proposed by himself; or upon a question or order arising out of the debate; but not otherwise, without the consent of a majority of the Senate, which shall be determined without debate. M. 306 sq.: B. 343.

Limit in debate.

35. No senator may speak twice to a question before the Senate, except in explanation of a material part of his speech, in which he may have been misconceived, and then he is not to introduce new matter. M. 312: B. 334.

Senator not to speak twice.

Exception.

36. A reply is allowed to a senator who has moved the second reading of a Bill, or made a substantive motion, but not to one who has moved an amendment, the previous question, an adjournment during a debate, a motion on the consideration of Commons' amendments, or an instruction to a committee. M. 314: B. 344.

When reply allowed.
