

unless the rise of temperature was more than $1\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ to 2° F. above that previously existing, we have not considered the reaction positive; and usually the febrile condition subsided gradually in about thirty-six to forty-eight hours. In the majority of cases the constitutional symptoms were slight, including mainly headache and slight *malaise* with nausea. Distinct rigors were uncommon. The highest temperature obtained was 105° F., and that after the injection of only $\frac{1}{2}$ milligramme.
