The interest generally felt in the Labrador Mission is considered sufficient warrant for publishing in a separate form the letters which have been lately received from the first two Missionaries. The Rev. H. P. Disney was stationed at Battle Harbour in the summer of 1850, but he was preceded on the coast of Labrador by the Rev. Algernon Gifford, who entered upon his ministerial duties at Forteau, on August 12th, 1349.

On November 15th, 1850, the Society granted the sum of 250l. to purchase some ground with premises at English Point, thus meeting the want mentioned by Mr. Gifford, page 11...
