A member of the board will be assigned to each of the committees to perform duties of a supervisory and administrative nature in connection with work of those departments represented by the committee. The vice-chairman of the board will give his

attention to all matters pertaining to legislation and to the reception of dis-tinguished visitors. tinguished visitors.

While the board believed that this scheme would result in the administrative and legislative functions of the council being satisfactorily separated, it was also held that the responsibility placed upon the members of the board would mean an increased efficiency and a general improvement in connection, with departmental service from a public standpoint. 


