Grand Master in His Address Touches on Coronation Oath and Proposed Constitution Changes. Toronto Junction, Sept. 3.—The twenty-second annual session of the Loyal True Blue Association opened in Campbell's Hotel, Toronto Junction, yesterday, under most auspicious circumstances, with over 200 delegates in attendance and more expected.

Coronation Oath. Before leaving this subject, I wish to refer to the coronation oath and the attempt made to change it, or practically do away with it. Because of the death of our Queen and the accession of our new King, our faith to underline the foundation on which is built the great Protestant nation, has become the target of the opponents of our religion. The matter was suggested that a few words be changed in the coronation oath, but we were not to let our faith be so easily shaken.

Our Constitution.
