

# PEACE HEADS FACE CHANCE OF DEADLOCK

Small Nations Present Obstacle To League.

SECOND HAGUE TO REPEAT?

Demand For Full Equality on World Council Might Submerge Great Powers.

PARIS, Feb. 5.—Although the five great Allied and associated powers which are directing the peace conference are directing the peace conference, which has turned over much of the work to commissions, the society of nations question, especially with reference to the smaller nations, is becoming rather a knotty problem.

The smaller nations, it is declared, want full equality in a society of nations and also greater powers than the great powers, and a situation similar to that at the second Hague peace conference appears to be in the making.

The experts on the society of nations question are hopeful of finding a way to get the smaller states to agree to the plan so that if each state is given a member on the supreme court of nations they might find themselves in the minority, although their interests might be much greater and probably would be.

**May Be Deadlock.**  
It is not believed that the great powers would consent to an arrangement of this sort, and a situation similar to that at the second Hague peace conference appears to be in the making.

The experts on the society of nations question are hopeful of finding a way to get the smaller states to agree to the plan so that if each state is given a member on the supreme court of nations they might find themselves in the minority, although their interests might be much greater and probably would be.

**League Preamble Adopted.**  
The preamble and two articles of the constitution of the society of nations were provisionally agreed upon last night by the commission of the peace conference appointed to deal with this subject. It was officially announced today. Satisfactory progress was made with other parts of the task.

The question of adding representatives of other powers to the commission, it was added, is being discussed. The peace conference committee on reparations met this forenoon and exchanged views regarding the principles covering reparations for damages caused by the enemy and based on memoranda which will be presented by the delegations of the countries affected. The memoranda will be discussed at the next meeting of the committee, which will be held on February 10.

**Italian-Slav Claims.**  
The Italian delegation has agreed upon a memorandum which it will present to the peace conference. It contains the Italian view regarding the disposition of the Adriatic states formerly belonging to Austria. This memorandum will be made public by the committee of the Jugo-Slav republics after representatives of the Jugo-Slav republics have been heard by the supreme court of nations, which is expected to be this afternoon or tomorrow.

**Claims Scaled Down.**  
The Italian delegation has decided not to enter any discussion with the Jugo-Slavs, at least at present, but to set forth the Italian viewpoint to their colleagues of the great powers, leaving the latter to judge between the conflicting claims.

An official communication issued this evening says:  
"The Allied peace delegates on February 5 heard M. Kramaric and M. Bionne on the claims of the Czechoslovak republic. A commission of two members to be elected each for France, Great Britain and the United States will be appointed to untangle the technical aspects of the question."

**The Labor Committee.**  
George Nicol Barnes, the British labor delegate to the peace conference, and M. Collard, the French minister of labor, were elected vice-presidents of the peace conference committee on international labor at its meeting Tuesday. The committee agreed to deal with international labor questions.

## BUYERS PAY 42 CENTS FOR EGGS; RETAIL HIGH UP

No Indication on Chatham Market of Cut in Price as Yet.

Two weeks ago the price paid by representatives of large packers was cents a dozen, but this week the price quoted in London to the buyers is 42 cents, and the buyers are paying 42 cents and pay freight charges, so they are quoting a lower price when buying. ## ST. MARYS COUNCIL MAKES APPOINTMENT OF TAX COLLECTOR

Name Road Supt. Later—Death of Noted Educationist, Dr. J. W. Baird.

ST. MARYS, Feb. 5.—At the regular meeting of the town council held Monday evening, tenders were opened for the position of tax collector for the year 1919. H. C. White was appointed tax collector for the year.

Only two tenders were opened for the position of road superintendent, one from John Murray, 1918 superintendent, offering his services at a yearly basis of \$1,000 per year. Both tenders were referred to board of works committee for consideration.

The matter of contracting for the delivery of 4,000 gallons of Tarvia for the business streets and a quantity of road oil for the street of the town, was left with the board of works committee, with power to act.

The matter of the water, light and heat board, addressed the council, and outlined the present condition of the waterworks and the protection, and claimed that by abolishing the old steam plant that a saving of some four or five hundred dollars a year had been made; that the hydro auditors who went over the plant yesterday had found that the waterworks were in good condition.
