## The United States Must Take Up Its Share.

We have seen the value of the British pound, the German mark, the French franc, the Italian lire, falling day after day as measured by the American dollar. Even our own dollar has suffered as a consequence of the economic disturbances created by the great war.

The United States has become immeasurably rich by reason of the war: all the rest of the world has become poorer and has had to run into debt to the States. It is true that the United States has had to assume a debt of its own on account of the war, but that is comparatively a trifle for so great and rich a nation.

But the war-to use the words of President Wilson-was entered upon to make the world safe for democracy. Now that it is over, and while democracy may have been saved, it has left the greatest economic disturbances that ever came to humanity; and while Germany is not fighting the allies, a great deal of Europe is still deluged with revolution, with civil war, and with war between various peoples, and still greater social and economic disorders threaten.
