CHEAP RENT FOR McCALLS

Sons of New York Life's President Live in Swell Apartment House Owned by the Company.

New York, Oct. 4.—That John R. Hegeman, president of the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company, borrowed \$50,000 from the New York Life Insurance Company at 11 per cent interest, a rate below the market rate, was brought out in the insurance investigation last week, but today President John A. McCall, of the New York Life Insurance Company, testified that he in turn borrowed \$75,000 from the Metropolitan at the same rate. This was in January, 1903; the loan was renewed in January, 1904, and ran until March, 1905, when the rate of interest was advanced to 2 per cent, at which rate it is still running.

VERY HEAVY DIVIDENDS

(New York Journal of Commerce) Total industrial dividends payable in October based on declarations thus far announced will total about \$27,500,000, the highest total in years. These figures represent an increase of \$10,000,000 over the same month last year and about \$4,000,000 as compared with the October payments in October, 1903. The favorable results of the current year were reached notwithstanding several important calamities, these, of course, were more than offset by increases and also by the resumption of dividends on the part of corporations which had previously ceased to make dividends to shareholders. SPECULATION: BANKRUPTCY

Southern Cotton Mill Dropped \$800,000 — Its Liabilities \$2,700,000.

CHARLOTTE, N. C., Oct. 3.—A special to the Observer from Union, S. C., says: A special meeting of the stockholders of the Union Cotton Mill of Union, S. C., one of the largest in the state, was held today to effect a reorganization. Stockholders were present from Baltimore, New York and other eastern cities. Expert accountants submitted a report showing the mill had total liabilities of \$2,700,000 and that the mill had been losing money for several years, only maintaining itself by speculation in cotton. Since Jan. 1st, however, it appears that the mill has lost \$800,000 by speculation. The report also showed that President Duncan was indebted to the mill for \$250,000 and the trustee, with which he is connected, owes it \$200,000.

THE COTTON LEAK

SARATOGA, N. Y., Oct. 3.—Habeas corpus proceedings in the case of Frederick H. Beckham in connection with the cotton leak scandal were argued before Judge Ray in the United States circuit court at Albany today and were adjourned for a further hearing on Oct. 6.
