Sec. 4. Each Society federated in the Council shall be entitled to five votes at the regular meetings in addition to that cast by the President. No delegate shall have more than one vote, though representing more than one Society.

Sec. 5. If any President or delegate should be unable to attend either Executive or Public Meetings the substitute appointed must be provided with written credentials of her power to vote.

Sec. 6. All other members of any Society belonging to the Council may be appointed to committees and have the privilege of participating in all discussions that may arise at the regular meetings, but not vote.

SEC. 7. All new business to be brought before a regular meeting of the Local Council must be submitted to the Executive Committee meeting of the preceding month as a notice of motion.

Sec. 8. Each Society federated in the Local Council shall present a five minutes report of its work, once during the year ; notice of meeting at which report will be received shall be sent to the Secretary of that Society by the Corresponding Secretary of the Local Council one month before the meeting.

Sec. 9. The President shall have power to call meetings of the Council at her discretion, and a special meeting may be called at the written request of three representatives of different federating Societies.

SEc. 10. The Executive Committee shall have power to make arrangements for all meetings.

## No. IV.-Duties of Officers.

Sec. 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Local Council and conduct them by the prescribed "order of business."

Sec. 2. One of the elected Vice-Presidents, in the absence or disability of the President, shall perform all duties incident to the office of the President.
