

Times of Governor Simcoe." One by Hon. J. G. Currie, St. Catharines, on "Brock and the War of 1812," and one by J. D. Servos on "Historical Societies." The anniversary, 17th September, was very successful. A poem dedicated to the Society by Mrs. Curzon was read, a paper by Canon Bull, addresses by Miss FitzGibbon, Capt. Cruikshank, Rev. J. C. Garrett, Col. Currie, Maj. Hiscott, Rev. P. Spencer were given. A remarkable and valuable exhibit, for which we were indebted chiefly to the zeal of Mr. Jno. D. Servos, consisting of documents, flags, weapons, old silver, Indian relics, old papers, etc., was much commended. The graves of some of them who died in defence of Niagara, May 27th, 1813, were decorated. A room has been kindly allowed us in the Court House, and a museum is being formed, there being already several hundred articles, the most valued historic articles being General Brock's cocked hat, a sword surrendered at the taking of Fort Niagara, copies of *Upper Canada Gazette*, 1794. Many pictures of Niagara in early days, and many books and papers printed in Niagara have been collected, and from the nucleus of what we hope may be a large and valuable collection. Our first pamphlet, "The Taking of Fort George," by Capt. Cruikshank, for which we secured an old engraving, has been well received, and we are about to print another pamphlet. We are pleased to know that we are to be honored with the meeting here on June 2nd, of the delegates of the Historical Association, and feel grateful that so much has been accomplished during the last year and hope to do still more in the future.
