Canadian Press OTTAWA, July 28-Production automobiles in Canada last month was slightly below the record output for May but considerably above June 1925. Of the 21,751 units turned out of Canadian factories in June 6,610 were open cars, 11,775 closed models, 2,886 trucks, 1,858 chassis and 26 taxi-cabs or busses.
