

Leading the way into the place, the chief of the bandits appeared to be surprised when he saw such a large crowd, but he was pushed on into the room by his seven armed and masked companions. The order was given to the crowd to line up, with hands in air, with the warning, "the first man who moved an eyelash would be shot."

While the bandits were emptying the pockets of their victims into small bags, several shots were fired through the window, and the stampede began. One man at the end of the line leaped through a glass window to the sidewalk, and men rushed for doors and windows. Every window was smashed in the panic and some victims were hurt by glass


