

THIRTY VICTIMS LOST \$100,000 IN DAYTIME HOLDUPS

200 Men in New York Cafe
Stampeded When Eight
Bandits Entered — Panic
Followed.

New York, Dec. 17.—Five daylight robberies on Tuesday in this city and vicinity by bands numbering more than twenty men, caused a loss of more than \$100,000 among about thirty victims.

were trying to hold them in such terror that their watches and money could be taken. Before the panic ended, the robbers had taken more than \$100,000 in cash and jewelry from the men, and many shots had been fired.

Leading the way into the place, the chief of the bandits appeared to be surprised when he saw such a large crowd, but he was pushed on into the room by his seven armed and masked companions. The order was given to the crowd to line up, with hands in air, with the warning, "The first man who moved an eyelash would be shot."

While the bandits were emptying the pockets of their victims into small bags, several shots were fired through the window, and the stampede began. One man at the end of the line leaped through a glass window to the sidewalk, and men rushed for doors and windows. Every window was smashed in the panic and some victims were hurt by glass and were bruised in the rush.

One man was captured after a gang had robbed Davidoff, a jeweler, of 1144 Madison avenue, of about \$5,000 in watches and diamonds. A civilian passing in an automobile saw four holdup men run out of the store and start away in a taxicab. He pursued them until he found policemen and caused the arrest of one of the men and the chauffeur.

four of the taxicab. Charles Galinski was arrested on the charge of acting in concert in the robbery, and Edward Marks, who had about \$2,500 worth of watches and jewelry in his possession, the police said, was arrested on the charge of robbery.

In a similar robbery, three men held up a man at the drug store of Abraham Weinstein of 1516 St. Nicholas avenue, and escaped with about \$80 from the cash register.

Bullets flew over the heads of school children on their way home to lunch when clerks were pursuing four men who had robbed a Sheffield milk store at 2838 Eighth avenue. The bandits escaped with about \$2,000 in cash.

Thirty-fifth, street station, prevented three holdup men from finishing their job in a saloon at 323 Second avenue. The patrolman arrived as three armed men were lining up the proprietor and his customers. Falvey and the men opened fire, and the patrolman thinks he wounded one of the robbers. He arrested Angelo Malley, of Bridgeport, Connecticut. About \$275 was stolen before the policeman arrived.
