



After remaining in the office in Montreal for some time, with no experience whatever in field work, classification or construction work, simply doing ordinary routine work in the office, Mr. Gutelius was taken out of the engineering department of the railway and sent to North Bay in the operating department, and made division superintendent in a road which was completed twenty-five years ago. All he had to do was to report on what went on from day to day, and month to month, a position which has frequently been referred to as the bone-yard by engineers and railway employes of that great company.
