SANDS OF THE DESERT

The Real Barren Spots of Northern Africa Have Hills and Valleys Just Like Any Other Section.

Sand as a feature of desert landscapes is not so prominent, as ordinarily supposed. Dunes of size are to be found in few places in America away from the seashore, but in Northern Africa most extensive areas are occupied by huge ridges. One may travel for days without seeing either a mound or the unbroken stretches of sand which figure so largely in literature.

Despite these facts, there is enough of fine particles of dust and broken rock present everywhere to become unpleasantly noticeable in a wind. One soon becomes accustomed to grit in the pockets, but when it finds a resting place in the footgear it becomes really obtrusive.

The least motion of the air disturbs the finer dust on the surface of the ground, and with increasing force of the wind larger particles are lifted and moved along, pelting and abrading everything in their path.
