The intimation is that, considering the character of the work the employees are not badly paid and that the agitation is not justified. Among the messengers, packers, etc., the highest salary is \$1,4150, the lowest \$600 and the average, \$994; typists, copyists and lower grade office help, highest salary \$1,300, lowest \$600, average \$1,216; stenographers, highest salary \$1,750, lowest \$1,100, average \$1,415.




