HALIFAX HORSE DROPS DEAD IN SYDNEY RACE

Sydney, N. S., Sept. 5.—Canadian Press (Sydney)—One of the biggest sensations of years at a horse track in this country was caused today at the Sydney trotting park when Commander Nelson, an eight year old green trotter, owned by Howard Quinn of Halifax, met death in the second heat of the 228 class. Billie Hood, who was driving the horse pulled him in between Bailey George and Crescens in an attempt to pass the former. His sulky brushed sharply against Crescens. He dropped behind and a second later hooked into the sulky of Carrie Todd. The crowd suddenly saw Commander Nelson make a terrific attempt to force ahead, then stiffly brace his feet in the turf. He rose into the air and fell on the point of the nose, bending his neck sharply. After he fell to the track he never moved. The shock of the collision threw both Hood and Jimmie Boutillier, driver of Carrie Todd, from their sulks. Carrie Todd tore driverless down the track at a gallop.

PHONE GIRL WINS RACE, DEFEATS WOMAN HIKER

Truro, N. S., Sept. 5.—Beating Mrs. Jeany Dill of Halifax, famed transatlantic hiker, by twenty feet, Miss Linda Lewis of Mable Hill, Truro, won a gas-up please hike for women around Onslow, about eight miles, this morning in one hour, twenty-five minutes and forty-five seconds. The finish was made at the athletic grounds here in the presence of 2,000 spectators. When 100 yards from the tape Mrs. Dill, who was close to Miss Lewis, started to close up the slight distance between them. Both were running. Friends of Miss Lewis encouraged her to make a last desperate effort. Mrs. Dill was almost alongside her rival, but Miss Lewis made a final effort and won Miss Mary Mills of Truro was third and Miss Gladys Black of Truro fourth. There were nine others. The winner is a daughter of William Lewis of Bible Hill. She is seventeen years old and a telephone operator in Truro.

MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRES

During a heavy electrical storm about noon on Saturday the steeple of the Methodist church at Lower Coverdale, near Moncton, was struck by lightning. Men quickly extinguished the blaze which resulted. Damage in the vicinity of \$700 was done.

Johnny Reid, of Amherst, aged twelve years, was struck by a float in a carnival yesterday and received injuries from which he died shortly after.

Fire in Dorchester on Friday night caused damage to the extent of about \$30,000. The buildings destroyed were the Eastern Lumber Mills, an old power house and an old foundry and warehouse. In addition about 30,000 feet of lumber belonging to W. Malcolm MacKay of this city were destroyed.

W. Scott Hoar, a native of Riverside, Albert county, was struck and killed by lightning on Saturday. He was forty-five years of age and leaves a wife and family. Death was instantaneous.

John J. Grant, a druggist of New Glasgow, N. S., was drowned while swimming at Black Point, Little Harbour, yesterday afternoon. The man was apparently seized with a cramp and sank before the eyes of his two brothers, who were near at the time of the accident. The body was recovered.

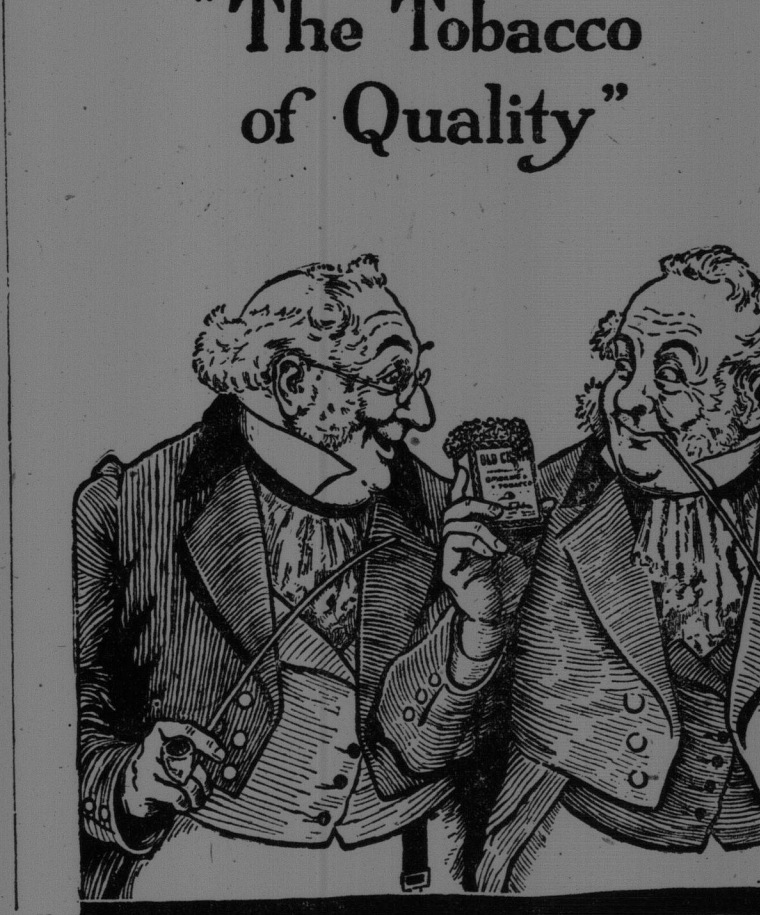
