GENERAL STRIKE

Airplane, Wireless, Cavalry and Police Forces in Elab-

orate Plan of Campaign.

Paris, Aug. 29.—Elaborate plans by the police appear to have nipped in the bud the general strike ordered by the extremist labor federation in sympathy with the Havre strikers and in opposition to the conservative labor federation. Cavalry today patrolled all points and a police airplane hovered over the city, keeping in touch by wireless telephone with the reserves entrusted with the task of dispersing all manifestants.

The taxicab drivers alone are idle. The railroads have not been affected. The city is quiet.

Havre, Aug. 29.—Despite the general strike here, the French line steamer La Savoie sailed for New York after last midnight, as scheduled. The Rochambeau will leave late today.
