Q. You are to give evidence about what you know of the accused going to Brighton on the night of 3/4 Sep 42?  
A. I drove him to Brighton that night.

Q. What happened?  
A. I drove him down and then came back and took Mr. Maw down.

Q. What time did you leave here?  
A. 1800 hours.

Q. What time did you leave Brighton?  
A. Around midnight.

Q. Did you see Mr. Knox before you left Brighton?  
A. I couldn't find him.

Q. What happened when you returned to camp?  
A. I immediately took Mr. Maw back to Brighton.

Q. Then what happened?  
A. I returned with Mr. Maw and Mr. Knox.

Q. Where did you find Mr. Knox?  
A. Down at the Provost place.

Q. Did he have a hat?  
A. I don't know.

Q. Did you see him wearing a hat when he got in the car?  
A. I don't believe he did.

Cross-Examination by the Defence

Q. How did you get separated from Mr. Knox in Brighton?  
A. We parked the car and left it for a few minutes and when we came back it was gone and he went up one street to look for it and I went up another. When I got back to where I had started I couldn't find him.
