- A.136. Well he had a cheque. Whether he received it while he was in the guard room or before I can't say.
- Q.137. Could you tell us anything about that cheque, the amount?
- A.137. The amount was twenty-five dollars.
- Q.138. Did you cash this cheque for him?
- A.138. I cashed the cheque sir.
- Q.139. Has he received any since that time while in the guard room?
- A.139. I can't tell you that sir.

- Q.140. Do you remember the date on which this cheque was received?
- A.140. I don't know the date it was received sir.
- Q.141. Was it while the accused was in the guard room?
- A.141. That I can't say sir.

- A.143. I done that sir.
