Bread and Butter Politics. Mr. Edgerton. In the last issue of your paper on "Ex-New Brunswick" under the heading "The only one" has transferred his allegiance to the United States (if such a man can have an allegiance to anything) tries to show his reasons for so doing and also the disabilities and limitations to which Canadians are subject. Two of the reasons why it is advantageous to live across the border are the educational advantages of the United States, and the liberality of its laws. They are alien to the British Canadian who makes up the great mass of the people - in many respects.
