

PROCEEDINGS

OF

The Annual Meeting of the Society.

The THIRTY-FIFTH ANNUAL MEETING of the MISSIONARY SOCIETY of the WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH IN CANADA, was held in Ottawa, on Monday, September 24th, 1860. The Rev. JOHN CARROLL in the Chair. The Meeting was opened with singing and prayer, and the Report having been read by the GENERAL SUPERINTENDENT OF MISSIONS, the following Resolutions were adopted:—

I. Moved by the Rev. W. POLLARD, seconded by the Rev. C. FRESHMAN, D. D.,—

That the Report, an Abstract of which has been now read, be adopted and printed; and that this Meeting devoutly offers to God its thanksgivings for the spiritual success granted to this Society, and to other evangelical Missionary Institutions.

II. Moved by the Rev. W. JEFFERS, seconded by the Rev. Mr. McEWEN,—

That this Meeting is deeply affected to learn from the Report that the Income at present is considerably less than the necessary Expenditure of the Society, and that there are requirements for additional Labourers from its Indian, Hudson's Bay, British Columbia, Domestic, French, and German Departments, which inadequate pecuniary means render it impracticable for the Society at once to supply.

III. Moved by the Rev. J. STINSON, D. D., President of the Conference, seconded by the Rev. Mr. ELLIOTT,—

That this Meeting cordially acknowledges the zealous and liberal efforts of the Officers, Collectors, and Contributors, adult and juvenile, of all the Branch Societies, and the countenance of other Christian Communities; and is profoundly impressed with the importance of immediate, and much increased effort, liberality, dependence upon God, and prayer for diffusing illimitably the benefits of Christianity.
