raies, were short in the straw, and the grain had not filled. Within the last ten days, however, the straw has shot up several inches, and the head is heavy and full. The out drop will be more than an average this year. The potatoes were never so luxuriant or abundant. This, the poor man's great resource, must be cheaper than in the year that has passed. An abundant crop of potatoes implies more swine and poultry. Turnips, which were supposed to have perished by the drouth and fly, have appeared in light green rows under the rain, and, though probably late, the general crop will be large. The early planted mangolds exceedingly fine everywhere, and an abundant supply of nourishing winter food for the cattle may be expected. In some low lying fields the hay has not been cut, but will be the moment the weather settles. Flax is everywhere a fine, tall, clean crop. It is now full of seed, and the Irish farmer ought to know that in wasting the seed he throws a very valuable portion of the crop. On the whole the harvest promises to be one of the most abundant we have had for many years.—
